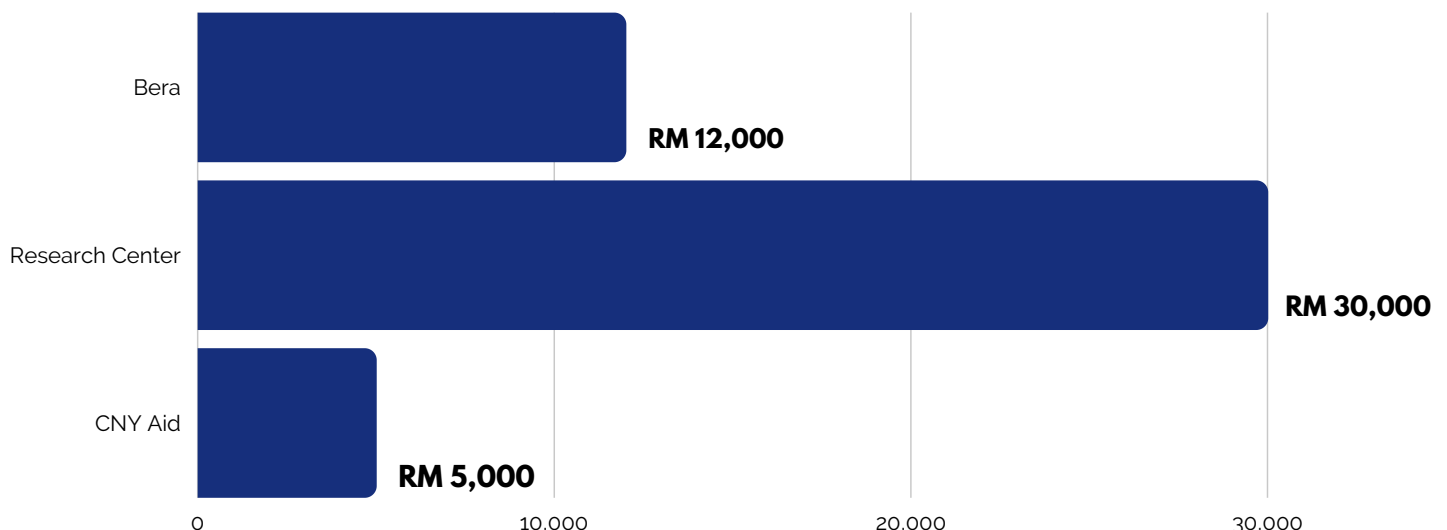
TOTAL NUMBER OF BENEFICIARIES
